

River Source hosted third Green Jobs Fair this year at Amy Biehl High School in Albuquerque

In November, River Source hosted a Green Jobs Fair at the Amy Biehl High School (ABHS) in Albuquerque - the third fair River Source has organized this year! In April, two fairs were held -- one in Taos and one at Santa Fe ECO. At ABHS, ten participating organizations, including Soilutions, the Institute for Applied Ecology, the Bernalillo Open Spaces, Albuquerque BioPark, Grower's Market, the Bosque Ecosystem Monitoring Program (BEMP), and more, came to share and represent their fields of work. People tabling at the fair shared their mission and job opportunities with approximately 150 high school students, explaining their approach to doing work, and what careers in their profession look like. Participants brought educational material about their organizations and the kind of work that occurs in their particular field. Students were able to explore a sector which for many of them are unfamiliar, and engage with professionals working in the burgeoning world of sustainability-related jobs.

In organizing these events, River Source cultivates job searching skills and recruits the next generation of professionals in natural resource stewardship, sustainable agriculture, and green infrastructure. The job fairs are combined with a green job postings on GreenJobsNM.org and group trainings in resume and cover letter writing to provide you with tools to connect with internships and jobs. Ultimately, the Green Jobs Project expands job possibilities for youth and connects energized and more culturally diverse youth to fill the vacuum created by retiring professionals, in the sustainability field.
